Prerequisite for admission to the bachelor's program

A) A person with full general or equal education has the right to study for a bachelor's degree program in International Relations, which has the relevant document (certificate) certified by the state and which will gain the right to study at European University Ltd. on the basis of the ranking of the scores obtained on the Unified National Examinations.

B) As a result of the Unified National Examinations, an entrant who has passed the English language in foreign languages and has a history, geography, mathematics or civic education (equivalent coefficient) in the elective subjects will be admitted to the Bachelor's degree program in International Relations.

They have the right to study at the program without passing the Unified National Examinations:

A) Foreign nationals and stateless persons who have received full general or equivalent education in a foreign country;

B) Georgian citizens who have received a full general or equivalent education in a foreign country and have studied in a foreign country for the last 2 years of full general education;

C) Persons (except students participating in the joint higher education program and students participating in the exchange educational program) who have lived in a foreign country for the last 1 year or more, are studying / have studied and have obtained credits / qualifications in a higher education institution recognized in a foreign country.

On the program also allowed:

The order of the Minister of Education and Science of Georgia №10 / N (4.02.2010) on the “Rules for Transfer from the Higher Education Institution to Other Higher Education Institutions and Approval of Fees” students shall be enrolled in accordance with the mobility rules. It is possible to enroll in mobility twice a year, within the timeframe established by the Ministry of Education and Science of Georgia, in compliance with the mandatory procedures and the rules established by the University.

Content and Structure of the program

The program is interdisciplinary and provides knowledge in International Economics and Law, International Security, Political Philosophy and Foreign Policy, it will also develop students with a range of professional skills necessary for successful decision-making, executive, analytical, and representative positions.

The subjects are distributed in the program according to the priority given to the mentioned study directions, which was determined according to their suitability and necessity for the discipline of international relations. (8:7:6:4:4).

Most of the courses are combined under the umbrella of foreign policy and include 8 compulsory subjects, in the field of political philosophy, the program includes 7 compulsory subjects, the international security direction covers 6 compulsory subjects, while international economics and law are given equal priority with 4-4 compulsory subjects.

Such prioritization takes place only in the case of compulsory courses, and elective courses in all of the above areas are 4-4. In addition, the program provides 8 subjects that serve the development of professional skills, and none of them is mandatory. Credits are distributed in such

a way that in addition to the compulsory subjects, from the third academic year, the student chooses 2 courses and one of them is definitely a professional skill.

According to the study directions, grouping of subjects and their above-mentioned prioritization aims to give consistency to the interdisciplinary program and to bring it under a unified logical framework. Otherwise, there is a risk of spreading scattered and superficial knowledge. Accordingly, the program is not a mechanical sum of 58 subjects (+10 university), but creates a single whole.

Knowledge of English at A2 level and further deepening of the B2.2 level is mandatory. As a second foreign language student can choose any of the other 5 working languages of the United Nations and study from A1 level to B1.2

The purpose of the program

The purpose of the Bachelor's Degree Program in International Relations are:

- I. To train highly qualified specialists with knowledge and skills relevant to the requirements of the European Educational Space and Employment Market, who will be able to carry out fruitful professional activities in decision-making, executive, analytical and representative positions.

- II. To provide students with an interdisciplinary knowledge of international relations from the perspective of all the basic sciences that are relevant to the analysis, prevention and response to complex and multifaceted problems of international relations and to manage the risks associated with them.

- III. Encourage students to develop the 'soft' skills, professional ethics and morals necessary for successful and dignified work in the academic, public, private and non-governmental sectors.

Learning Outcomes

Consistent and complete implementation of the goals set by the program will ensure that the framework of the higher education qualification framework achieves the corresponding results of the first level of higher education (bachelor's) qualification description, namely:

A. **Knowledge and understanding**

A1. System - The student knows the fundamental principles and theories of law, economics, politics and security, can critically understand their systemic features at the local, national or international level and is familiar with the latest trends in these fields;

A2. Functionality - The student knows the basic institutions and subjects of law, economics, politics and security, history and current challenges, the dynamics in each field and the main factors influencing it;

B. **Skills:**

B1. Analytics - The student is able to identify, analyze, and discuss ways to solve legal, economic, political, and security problems in the context of international relations;

B2. Practicality - The student has a basic set of practical skills and can apply the knowledge acquired within the program directly in the analytical, representative, executive or academic sectors in practice;

C. **Responsibility and autonomy**

C1. Values - The student is endowed with knowledge of professional ethics and conducts his or her further development in accordance with universally established moral norms and European values such as human rights, sustainable development, democracy and good governance;

C2. Effectiveness - The student has the ability to independently manage his / her own development-oriented activities and take responsibility for it; The student has the autonomy and responsibility to plan the further learning process with a high degree of independence.

Field of employment

A graduate of the International Relations Program can work in academic, public, private, and non-governmental decision-making, executive, analytical, and representative positions.

Potential employment sectors may be a research center, a non-governmental organization, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in the public sector or any other ministry or department of international relations, academia, regional and international organizations and any of their agencies or institutions, diplomatic service, etc.

Prerequisite for admission to the bachelor's program

- A) A person with full general education or a document equivalent to him / her, who acquires the right to study at European University Ltd. on the basis of the ranking of the coefficients of the scores obtained in the Unified National Examinations.
- B) Compulsory subjects for enrollment in the program are: Georgian language and literature, English language, Mathematics/History.
- C) Minimum competency threshold for the Unified National Examinations - overcoming the minimum threshold defined by the legislation. Overcoming the minimum threshold set by law in the following subjects: Georgian language and literature, history / mathematics, English language.

They have the right to study at the program without passing the Unified National Examinations:

- A) Foreign nationals and stateless persons who have received full general or equivalent education in a foreign country;
- B) Georgian citizens who have received a full general or equivalent education in a foreign country and have studied in a foreign country for the last 2 years of full general education;
- C) For foreign nationals (except students participating in the joint higher education program and students participating in the exchange educational program) who have studied / are studying and have obtained credits / qualifications in a higher education institution recognized in a foreign country in accordance with the legislation of this country.
- D) For Georgian citizens (except for students participating in the joint higher education program and students participating in the exchange educational program) who lived in a foreign country during their studies at a foreign higher education institution for at least 75 days during one of the semesters and have received credits / qualifications in a higher education institution recognized in a foreign country in accordance with the legislation of this country.

The persons specified in paragraphs "a", "b" and "c" are obliged to pass the interview organized by European University in order to determine the knowledge of the program language. Persons referred to in paragraph "d" shall be eligible to continue their studies at European University if they have successfully passed the General Skills Test organized by the LEPL National Examination and Assessment Center.

Program Structure

The Bachelor of Laws program includes 240 credits, of which:

Note: A number of courses are offered as an alternative to English at the student's request. Prerequisite for studying these courses is knowledge of English at least B2 level (along with other admission prerequisites, if any).

One academic year includes 40 weeks. One semester consists of 20 weeks, including 15 weeks of learning and 5 weeks of session. In particular, the 17th and 18th week of the final exam period, the 19th and 20th week of the additional final exam period. The interval between the final and the relevant additional exam shall be not less than 5 days after the announcement of the final exam results. Intermediate exams are held on the 8th week.

The learning courses provided by the bachelor program are aimed at achieving the goals set in the program and the formation of relevant competencies for the qualification acceptable as a result of the study. The logical sequence of the formation of the competencies to be achieved determines the content, structure and curriculum of the bachelor program.

The purpose of the program

The purposes of the Bachelor of Laws Education Program are:

- 1) To train a competitive, qualified lawyer in the local and international labor market with a broad knowledge of national law and in-depth knowledge of public, private, criminal or international law;
- 2) To train a specialist who, based on the acquired knowledge, will have the problem of identifying, solving, evaluating, reasoning, substantiating, producing legal documents, sources of law (scientific publications, legislative changes, court decisions) ability to find and track news in the jurisdiction, process it and convey a reasoned position in written and oral form;
- 3) Also, train a specialist with professional and ethical values, social responsibility and democratic values.

Learning Outcomes

- I. The graduate will know the essence of law and the fundamental principles of law; Historical sources of Georgian law; Sources of modern national law;
Norm structure, function, and methods of explanation; Theories of law.
- II. The graduate will know the concept and functions of the state; Forms of state governance and territorial arrangement; Key aspects of constitutional law; Fundamental human rights and freedoms; The essence, principles and process of general administrative law.
- III. The graduate will know the private law system; Material and procedural aspects of civil law; Property Law; Binding law, including contractual and statutory binding relationships; Family and Corporate Law.
- IV. The graduate will know the basic principles of criminal law:
Types and categories of crime; Material and procedural aspects; The essence of criminal liability and types of punishments;
Procedural guarantees for criminal investigation and trial.

- V. The graduate will know the sources of international law, the fundamental principles of international law and customary norms; International legal-political institutions; Peculiarities of the application of international treaties and conventions at the national level; International courts and tribunals, including rules and procedures.
- VI. The graduate will have the skills of legal writing and research; Be able to find a relevant normative base and legal sources, as well as develop and submit legal documents (contract, complaint, petition) taking into account the specific formal-substantive requirements.
- VII. In accordance with the sectoral direction, the graduate will be able to perceive the legal issue, to understand it from different perspectives, as well as to develop theses for the solution of legal problems and to substantiate the chosen approach.
- VIII. The graduate will have good presentation skills and will be able to effectively defend his or her position by using relevant legal arguments. Will have the ability to communicate effectively in Georgian and English.
- IX. The graduate will be able to find news in the field of law (legislative changes, scientific news, precedent law) and best practices.
- X. The graduate will be able to carry out professional activities with the protection and responsibility of legal ethics, to act in accordance with the rule of law, justice, equality, fundamental human rights, democratic and legal society.

Field of employment

A graduate of the Bachelor of Laws program can work in any position in the public or private sector where an academic degree in Bachelor of Laws is required and the law does not require passing a state certificate exam. Potential sectors of employment are ministries, the Parliament of Georgia, the common courts, the Constitutional Court, various legal entities under public law, non-governmental organizations, private companies and organizations of various profiles, private law firms, law firms, etc.

The bachelor of psychology program includes 240 credits, of which:

- University learning courses - 34 credits
- Compulsory social science learning courses - 10 credits
- Compulsory specialty learning courses - 115 credits, including bachelor's thesis - 10 credits
- Elective learning courses of the specialty - 30 credits
- Practice component - 10 credit
- Free credits of the program - 41 credit

The Bachelor programs are aimed at achieving the goals set in the program and the development of relevant competencies for the qualifications to be obtained as a result of the study. The logical sequence of the formation of the competencies to be achieved determines the content, structure and curriculum of the bachelor program.

The purpose of the program

Based on the mission of European University, the purpose of the psychology bachelor's program are:

- (1) To develop the student's necessary knowledge, skills and value system in order to obtain specialists who are competitive in the local and international labor market.
- (2) To train a specialist who will have a modern knowledge of psychology as a history of science, development, basic theoretical currents and empirical findings.
- (3) Also, prepare a specialist who, based on the instructions of the supervisor, will be able to understand and apply the basic research methods required by psychology as a science and, considering the academic standards of research, develop appropriate research design, analyze data and interpret results.
- (4) To develop students 'important skills for the 21st century such as: collaboration, group work, creativity, critical thinking, and problem solving.

Learning Outcomes

- 1) The graduate will be able to develop psychology, as a science, subject and objectives, basic concepts, developmental stages, basic directions;
- 2) The graduate will be able to generalize, systematize and integrate the knowledge gained in various fields of psychology around the main categories of psychology;
- 3) The graduate will be able to plan small-scale research based on pre-defined guidelines, select target groups, interview, group data, process, describe results, report and research project;

- 4) The graduate will be able to identify and evaluate the determinants, dispositional, and situational stimuli of human behavioral activity based on the specifics of the job;
- 5) The graduate will be able to draw appropriate conclusions based on a critical analysis of complex and incomplete information (including recent research);
- 6) The graduate will have the ability to communicate and work in a team, with critical thinking and creativity needed to solve a difficult problem.
- 7) The graduate will be able to assess the problematic situation in the social environment, draw conclusions and make optimal decisions;
- 8) The graduate will be able to perform professional activities with the necessary professional responsibility, adhering to ethical norms and standards.

Field of employment

A graduate of the Bachelor of Psychology program can hold positions in both public institutions, including education, penitentiary, defense, health, and so on. In the system, as well as in the private and non-governmental sector, in the media, in international funds, etc.

The growth of the demand for psychologists is due to: new projects in the field of education, including the implementation of new theories of teacher training, inclusive education, education in general; There is a growing demand for health psychology, where graduates can work in clinics and outpatient clinics. A graduate of psychology can continue to work wherever there is a need, including psychological assistance for the developmental disabilities of children and adolescents and patients with disabilities. Demand for psychologists has increased in educational institutions such as schools and kindergartens, as well as professions in demand in day care centers.

A graduate of the Bachelor of Psychology program can continue to work in corporate, consulting, marketing, and public relations. In the electoral system, political PR image, and other relatively new relationships are explored and harmonized with reality.

The purpose of the program

The program is in line with the mission of European University and envisages the training of a graduate with theoretical knowledge and practical skills in the field of English philology, who will be critical, will have innovative and academic skills and knowledge of intercultural dialogue and will be competitive in local and international employment.

1. The English bachelor's degree program in English Philology aims to master at least two foreign languages - **English C1 (Advanced - Effective Operational Proficiency)** and **the second foreign language (Russian or French) B2 (Limited Developed)** European Foreign Language Recommendation. According to the framework (The Common European Framework of Reference for Languages).
2. The purpose of the program is for the graduate to have a thorough knowledge in the field of English Philology.
3. The purpose of the program is for the graduate to develop skills in the analysis and literary discussion of transfer, basic research and literary works.

The importance of the program determines in the modern multicultural world, where English is seen as a **lingua franca**, a necessity for specialists with a good knowledge of English and humanistic values.

Learning Outcomes

Sectoral and General (Transfer)

Prerequisite for admission to the program

Bachelor's / Master's degree in a relevant subject / subject group of the National Curriculum or a person with an equivalent academic degree who has been certified in the subject by the National Center for Assessment and Examinations. Also, a person is required to pass an internal examination determined by European University.

Structure of the program

The teacher training program includes 60 credits. One academic year includes 40 weeks, one semester 20 weeks.

The assessment of the achievement of the learning outcomes of the components of the educational program will be completed in the same semester in which it was conducted. The interval between the final and the relevant additional test must be at least 5 days after the announcement of the test results.

To successfully complete a teacher training program, a student needs to take a course in the program:

General Pedagogy and Psychology Training Courses (with built-in school practice, compulsory module for all directions) - 30 credit;

Training courses in the relevant field teaching methodology (with built-in practice) - 20 credit (including all compulsory courses);

School practice module – 10 credit (independent course of school practice defined for the relevant direction);

The purpose of the program

To train Elementary, Middle and High school teachers with relevant competencies in the current legislation of Georgia, international standards, the Code of Professional Ethics for Teachers, Professional Standards, Sectoral Characteristics, which will be critical thinking, innovative and academic skills, civic awareness and democratic values. Will have the necessary knowledge and skills to teach the relevant subject, will be focused on continuous professional development, will be competitive, news-receiving and introductory in pedagogical practice.

Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the educational program, the graduate will be able to:

- Planning, conducting and evaluating the student-centered learning process, taking into account the national goals of general education, the national curriculum, and the needs of the student.
- Effective use of knowledge of personality, development and education theories to create a safe, free and motivating learning environment for each student's individual, special needs, their cultural diversity, differentiated approaches;
- Targeted use of student assessment methods to assess the achievement and progress of each of them;
- Planning and conducting extracurricular activities based on students' interests and abilities;
- Integrating democratic values, sustainable development goals into the upbringing of a citizen with a responsibility to the social and natural environment of the individual in the learning process;
- Use of new knowledge, trends and results of modern research in the science of education for the purpose of continuous professional development; Researching one's own pedagogical practice and perfecting pedagogical activities based on the results, taking into account the legislative bases of the education system;
- Seek, select, create, and use assistive resources and ICT technologies to improve outcomes based on students' needs;

Prerequisite for admission to the master's degree:

A person with a bachelor's degree in law or a document equivalent to him / her will be admitted to the program and as a result of passing the specialty and testing in a foreign language (English, German, French B2 (see “Rules for Determining the Linguistic Competence of a Student of European University”) in accordance with the rules established by European University Ltd. gain the right to study for a master's degree in law. Verbal competence can be verified by presenting the following certificate:

They have the right to study for a master's degree program without a general master's degree:

- A) for candidates for master's degree who have received a document certifying the academic degree of relevant higher education in a foreign country;
- B) for persons (other than students participating in the joint higher education program and students participating in the exchange educational program) who have lived in a foreign country for the last 1 year or more, are studying / have studied and have obtained credits / qualifications in a foreign country in accordance with the higher education institution Master's degree;
- C) for candidates for master's degree, who have been enrolled in a higher education institution in accordance with Article 52, Paragraph 3 of the Law of Georgia on Higher Education.

D) Studying in a higher education institution without passing the general master's exams is allowed for foreign citizens, who have gained the right to continue their education in a higher education institution of Georgia in accordance with the rules and within the timeframe established by the Ministry of Education and Science of Georgia, before the enactment of this law and have a document certifying higher education recognized by a state issued in Georgia.

E) Studying in a higher education institution without passing the general master's exam is allowed for the person who has exceeded the relevant threshold in the exam envisaged by the list of international exams approved by the Ministry of Education and Science of Georgia.

The program will also allow:

The order of the Minister of Education and Science of Georgia №10 / N (4.02.2010) on the “Rules for Transfer from the Higher Education Institution to Other Higher Education Institutions and Approval of Fees” students shall be enrolled in accordance with the mobility rules.

The right to mobility and internal mobility arises in the student only in the field of educational software that corresponds to the type of general master's exam passed by him..

Structure of the program

The Master of Laws program consists of compulsory theoretical, research-methodological, practical components and elective courses.

To successfully complete the program, the student must accumulate **120 credits**, including:

30 ECTS credits are devoted to developing practical skills, including **15 credits** from a law clinic, **10 credits** from a Civil Law practical course (Street Law).

45 ECTS credits are intended for the research-methodological component of law, including **5 credits** for legal research methodology and writing standards, 8 credits for interdisciplinary research paper - **essay**, **25 credits** for master's thesis.

Under the **40 ECTS** credits, the student is free to take a learning course in accordance with his / her interests from the learning courses offered within the framework of the Master of Laws program.

Note 1: The list of subjects and clinics is not exhaustive. Individual components may be passed on by the student in other (non-recommended) semesters by adhering to the prerequisites (if any).

Note 2: Within the framework of the learning courses, a number of learning courses are offered in English, German and / or French, according to the student's wishes.

Note 3: Registration for the master's thesis takes place in the first academic week of the fourth semester.

One academic year includes 40 weeks, one semester 20 weeks, including 15 weeks of study, the remaining 5 weeks of session. In particular, the 17th and 18th weeks of the final exams, the 19th and 20th weeks of the final exams. The interval between the final and the relevant additional test must be at least 10 days.

The purpose of the program

1. To train personnel who have deep and systematic knowledge in the field of private, public or criminal law, as well as personnel who know the basic features of national and foreign legal systems;
2. To prepare personnel who will have the necessary critical, analytical thinking, practical skills necessary for a lawyer and will be able to conduct research / practical activities independently;
3. To promote the establishment of European legal values and the principles of academic good faith in the country.

Field of employment

The employment field of a graduate of the Master of Law program is determined by the completion of the Master's degree program - the Master's program prepares the student to "enter" the judiciary, prosecutor's office and / or other legal professions. The pre-state certification exam is a prerequisite for a master of law to "enter" a separate profession.
