DESCRIPTION

The purpose of the meeting is to introduce students common medicinal plants in Georgia. Humans have been in direct contact with nature for centuries, utilizing the plant wealth derived from it as vitamin-rich food and remedies for pain relief caused by various injuries and diseases. More than a third of medicinal products are of plant origin or are directly related to plants. There is a large group of remedies in which herbal preparations are dominant or one of the most important components. The range of medicinal plants used by modern European and international scientific medicine has been gradually formed over time. Most of these plants have a centuries-old history and have been known since ancient times. Georgia is rich in flora and is, therefore, one of the wealthiest countries in terms of its organic world of plants. The peculiarity and diversity of plant distribution are determined by ecological conditions, variety of air and terrain, geological structure, geographical location, paleogeographic past (the history of the formation of the organic world), and human influence. There are 5,000 species of plants in Georgia, and many of them are interesting from a healing perspective for both humans and animals. The study of these plants remains relevant and important in terms of understanding their effectiveness.
